

## Agnes Morley Project

Early June (2008) was planting time for our two spring civic improvement projects. At **Agnes Morley**, 249 Milbank Avenue, we refurbished the entrance driveway plantings with perennials around the flag pole and planted flowering annuals in their four flower boxes lining the patio. Existing rhododendron and hosta were moved from the flagpole area to the south end of the patio. At Wilbur Peck on Davis Avenue, a red maple was planted in a courtyard replacing a tree, originally planted during the GF landscaping in 1998-9, which had died.
